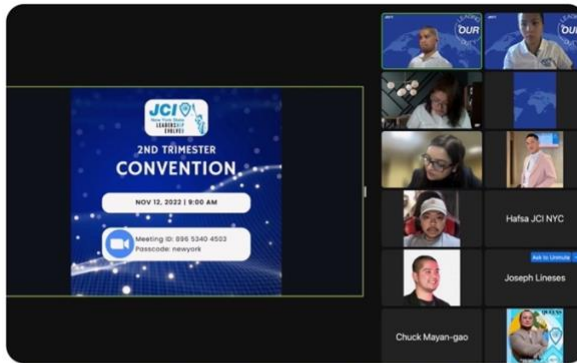

All events were successful and well attended by nonmembers, members, officers, advisers, and alumni. The Chapter signed up a total of **9 new members** for the first tri and provided our members' various training and events to join. The big event in the first tri was the 59th Induction, where we had NVP Jessper as our guest speaker and Deputy Consul General of the Philippine Consulate in NY our special guests. It was a night to remember since we gave and recognized 2 JCI NYS Governor, 3 JCI Senator that night and Inducted the 2022 Officers to end the night. The chapter profited \$1k to use for the chapter's upcoming events and raised \$500 for the “Operation Brotherhood: Art for a Cause,” which later on collected total of \$3k to use for food, drinks, Livelihood and rehabilitation program in the Philippines for almost 1000 families affected by Typhoon Odette.

The second trimester was warmer weather, and the chapter had **27 events** (see the event calendar), most of it was inperson events. It was nice to get back to normal slowly and met JCI members and officers in person. The chapter provided and executed a variety of events to the members to help develop their skills in different area. During the 2nd tri the chapter had few JCI Intl visitations from **JCI Switzerland, JCI Philippines, and JCI Jamaica**. (see picture). We welcomed them with movie night and invited to join to our local events. The Chapter signed a total of **6 new members** during and after the chapter events.

The third trimester the chapter had **20 dates total** in the calendar, including an invitation from community leaders and chapter community events such as Blood Donation Drive, and Phil-NY Senators Picnic, the chapter successfully participated and continued the two legacy projects to volunteered at 17Mile Water Station for NYC Marathon 11.6.22 and Co-sponsored at 34th Simbang Gabi and participated to Live Nativity Play. Our biggest event for the third tri was the Carboloadng in Philippine-Consulate in NYC with 280+ registered attendees (intl/local runners, and volunteers) for NYC Marathon. Be a conscious speaker and speak the truth about the Jaycees. Even if the information comes from former members, correct them right away if they developed the wrong idea or apologize if they experienced something negative.

APPENDIX A ROSTER OF CHAPTER OFFICERS' FUNCTIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

President - The President is the overall administrator and Chief Executive of the chapter and is in-charge of all areas of responsibilities, including but not limited to, chairing executive committees and general membership meetings, appointing legal counsel, state director, and all non-elected staff officers positions. The President also supervises all areas of program development and trains members into becoming officers and project chairpersons.

Vice Presidents - The positions of the five Vice Presidents – Management Development, Individual Development, Community Development, Membership Services and International Affairs, assure the Board and membership that equal emphasis is placed on all areas of the "total Jaycee concept". Detailed and specific responsibilities are described in each area of development programming. General functions and responsibilities include the following:

1. Develop and conduct a member survey to determine the strengths, weaknesses and interests of the chapter and community.
2. Develop a plan of action based on the survey.
3. Develop annual growth plan and program evaluation.
4. Coordinate with the treasurer in each specific area of programming development portion of the chapter budget.
5. Coordinate the selection and training of project chairpersons with the assigned director.
6. Contribute monthly articles for the chapter newsletter.
7. Provide a written evaluation of the annual progress of the development programming area by preparing a year end programming book.

Director(s) - Serves as elected members of the Board, which is the policy-making body of the chapter. Communicates with assigned members. Assists in training project chairpersons. Manages assigned single project categories. Provides general assistance and support to the Vice-Presidents.

Treasurer - Reconciles monthly bank statements. Provides a financial statement for each board of directors meeting. Coordinates the chapter dues billing system. Pays all bills. Deposits all receipts. Prepares an annual budget, coordinates with each officer responsible for any income or expense. Supervises the activities of the ways and means committee and coordinates an annual audit of the chapter financial statement.

Auditor - *Conducts an audit of the chapter financial documents once a year. Certifies financial statements of the chapter for the board of directors' presentation. (VACANT)*

Secretary - *Keeps accurate records of the proceedings of all chapter meetings. Prepares minutes for approval at the next scheduled meeting. Counts and records votes at membership and board meetings. Assists president in preparing the agenda. Handles all chapter correspondence. (VACANT)*
